Public Forum

-There were no Parishioners attending, so no comments

Councillors

- Library facilities.

A further discussion was held about the options put forward by WBC. It was felt that in view of very few parishioners using the previous mobile service, and the two options of a pop-up library or Community Bookshelf being less than ideal, a recommendation should be made to use WBC's own e-book service for a period of time. All feedack from Parishioners on the effectiveness of this service would be welcome.

- Bus Service

Last month it was reported that the Community Connect service has been extended to go to Royal Berkshire Hospital. This was incorrect. It has been extended to Thatcham Community Hospital and Theale.

- Aldermaston Wharf parking

There have been numerous objections to the WBC proposals to alleviate parking problems on Mallards Way.

Planning Matters

- 25/02119/HOUSE: 27 Mallard Way, Aldermaston Wharf. Application approved.

Parish Councillors

- School Security
- There has been no response from WBC to the PC request to advise on security matters for schools after the vandalism incident in October.
 - -School car parking bay painting This matter has been passed to WBC.
- -Bird Survey
- A bird survey was carried out at Field Barn Farm which identified 33 different species of birds. The detailed summary will be put onto the Beenham Online website for parishioners who are interested.
- -Analogue landline telephone switchover
- -BT will be switching over from the old analogue landlines to Digital Voice using broadband routers to deliver the phone service by 2027. Some Parishioners will have received letters outlining how and when this will be done... others have not. This was discussed in relation to some issues that some people may have. Not all parishioners have access to internet and broadband services and they should be provided with plug in boxes to maintain their phone services. However, in the case of power cuts equipment will not work. In case of a power cut, BT says that a mobile phone should be used, but Beenham is notorious for poor mobile signal coverage. This could be a problem especially in the case of emergency calls being necessary, and our MP, Olivia Bailey, is aware of these issues.

The Digital Poverty Alliance has a good pamphlet for people seeking futher information.
